APRIL MEETING

Saturday morning, April 1st our club ride was once again at the Dorsey House in St. Clair County between Avoca and Wadham's on the Mill and Black Rivers. We departed our favorite dealership at 11:15 a.m. sharp with yours truly in the lead. I was guided by my trusty side kick Duncan.

As we motored up Van Dyke Ave, 10 bikes and 12 riders in all, the sky was overcast and there was a little chill in the air. Somewhere around 18 Mile Road my trusty side kick tapped me on the back and motioned me to look to my left. In his left hand Duncan was holding the communication patch cord that connected his helmet head set to the bike's intercom system. He wanted to know if I could hook it up for him. Apparently it popped out sometime between the time he put on his helmet and Metropolitan Parkway. In half sign language and half yelling I told him to try and connect it himself. That didn't work. I then indicated that we'd have to stop somewhere up the road where it was safe.

We turned east on 32 Mile Road and across from the Ford Motor plant there is a restaurant with a large parking lot and entrances at either end of the lot back onto 32 Mile Road. We led the group into the lot and I was able to get out of my seat, hook Duncan's gear back up and get back in the saddle before the tail bike rolled into the lot. We then got back on the road again.

The ride took us to Armada Ridge Road through Armada to School Section Road. That road has two nice sweepers, one to the left, and the other to the right. From there we went north on M-19 or the Richmond Road up through Memphis and Emmett to Brockway and M-136. M-136 has a couple of nice turns from Brockway heading into Avoca. Once out of Avoca the speed limit climbs back up to 45 and then 55 as it heads for the Black River Valley fishing area. About 3 miles from the river there are two big right sweepers. The first just warms you up for the second. As we were leaving Avoca our tail bike passed the column and quickly disappeared ahead of us. He was headed for some serious speed around the two upcoming turns. The nine bikes maneuvered through both sweepers nicely and were entering the twisties in the river valley when we met the former tail bike as it zoomed by us in the opposite direction. We weren't sure if he wasn't staying for lunch or he'd forgotten his wallet.

Minutes later we turned into the Dorsey House parking lot and lined our nine rides up. The 10th bike was no where to be seen. We made our way inside and commenced to put 4-5 tables together for lunch. As always the Dorsey House has a great menu and excellent food. Today's lunch special was a beer battered fish and chips with coleslaw.

Shortly after the menus were handed out and the drink orders taken, I walked our 10th bike operator and former tail bike. Now there were 12 of us for lunch. We arrived at the road house about 12:35 and it was after 1:30 when we all departed. The sky was just as cloudy and the chill was even more prevalent than when we arrived. But we had enjoyed the ride, good food and great company which made the ride home a little bit better despite the weather conditions. We made some new friends and indulged in good conversation all over a short ride and a good meal. It was well worth the time and price of admission.

Next month the ride is in May and hopefully the weather will be a little more accommodating. The May ride is to Waldo, Ohio for fried baloney sandwiches. If you have a little time and never enjoyed a fried baloney sandwich you have to join the club on this ride. Like it or not,

you'll talk about it many times over. You rode 165 miles one way to chow down on a fried baloney sandwich. It's a sandwich like you have never tasted before.



The state legislature in Mississippi has changed the way a motorcycle registration fee is calculated, a move that has tripled the cost of license plates for some bikes. Now the price of tags is based on the assessed value of the motorcycle. Previously, the cost was based on the size of the bike's engine, regardless of its value. Hmmm.

The Macomb County Motorcycle Safety Foundation, now known as MSP (Macomb Safety Program), recently celebrated its 25th anniversary. Pavement buckling forced portions of the community college parking lot to be closed over the years, but that's remedied now. Fresh pavement commemorates the silver anniversary offering increased safety for students. Over 50,000 riders have gone through the motorcycle classes at the largest individual training site in the state. Our club roster includes a few MSP instructors so you usually don't see them at the monthly club rides. They're busy teaching students! Congrats to all!

While working the Cycle World International Bike show, I visited the J & H Digital Imaging Inc. booth. These folks operate a local custom printing business capable of - quite simply - printing almost anything on almost anything! These images don't sit on the top layer of the shirts J & H provide, as the case in typical silk-screening, but actually embed into the surface for greater durability. Their ink contains UV protection, is extremely vibrant for true color match, will not crack or peel, and is bleach resistant – all great features for T-shirts.
