

JUNE MEETING

Saturday morning, July 1st was a fantastic day for a ride. So they went to lunch. No one wrote to tell us what happened so we'll have to guess.

JULY 1st DEMO

At 11am, right after the meeting, the owner of Graphic Works demonstrated a clear laminate protector for your motorcycle. He applied it to the demo 1200LT on the floor. The shields are laser cut from flat sheets into shapes that can cover critical spots on a motorcycle to protect them from bugs, stones, etc. These sheets have moisture activated glue on the back side to hold them on the motorcycle. The sheets once applied are clear. They are guaranteed for as long as you have your bike. They will not discolor or come off accidentally. The only requirement is that you have to wash your bike periodically. Road dirt left on the material for months will cause the material to darken and dirt will collect along the edges of the shields where the adhesive is exposed. These products will be available through the dealership. You can install them yourselves or they can be installed by Graphics Works at the dealership... The shields turned virtually invisible after installation on the demo LT.

MOTORCYCLE SAFETY

Lately there have been some unusually stories in the news about motorcycle accidents. One such story is the man who they thought was hit by lightning while in heavy traffic in Colorado. The second motorcyclist was killed by a falling tree in New Hampshire. The stories are posted below. These stories bring to mind that we have to watch out for other drivers but also for mother nature. I rode in some pretty strong thunderstorms and always worried about the lightning but never thought I made a very good lightning rod. Getting hit by lightning or a falling tree are pretty rare occurrences. Deer are another story. Michigan had 11 people killed by deer last year, 3 were motorcyclists. Keep an eye out especially on secondary roads. The chances increase at dusk or after dark.

Lightning Strike Kills Colo. Motorcyclist

WESTMINSTER, Colo. - A motorcyclist died after he was struck by lightning while riding in rush hour traffic between Denver and Boulder, police said.

Witnesses reported seeing a flash of light shortly before the motorcyclist struck the center divider on U.S. 36 Wednesday, police spokesman Tim Read said.

Gary Missi, 46, of Longmont was pronounced dead at the scene.

A coroner's investigation was under way to determine whether the lightning bolt, the collision or something else caused his death, Read said.

The lightning blasted a 4-inch-deep hole in the highway and sent chunks of asphalt hurtling across the highway.

Falling tree kills biker on I

WATERVILLE VALLEY, N.H. - A Canadian woman who was a passenger on a motorcycle riding on the Kancamagus Highway yesterday afternoon was killed in a bizarre accident when a tree fell on her, according to authorities.

Louise Croft, 43, of Ontario, Canada, is the seventh motorcyclist since Friday to die on New Hampshire roadways during the annual Motorcycle Week.

Croft was a passenger on a motorcycle that had just left the Sabbaday Falls turnout on Route 113, the Kancamagus Highway that stretches between Conway and Lincoln.

New Hampshire State Police Sgt. Kevin Duffy said she was struck by a "decayed" tree that fell suddenly on the road. Fire and ambulance personnel from Conway Village were dispatched to the accident 15 miles west of town at about 4:15 p.m., Deputy Chief Keith Noble said.

The initial call, Noble said, was that a tree had

fallen on a motorcyclist.

"As we were responding, we were told that the patient was not breathing and had no pulse and that CPR was being performed," he said.

Noble said that it appeared that the woman was traveling with a group of motorcyclists and that she was a passenger; her husband was driving another motorcycle.

"When we got there, there were bystanders and friends doing CPR," Noble said. "I commended them for the fantastic job they did."

Noble described the tree as a birch measuring about 10 inches in diameter. It appeared that the group of motorcyclists was just departing the turnoff when the accident happened.

Croft, who suffered a massive head injury, was rushed to Memorial Hospital in North Conway, where she was pronounced dead just before 5:30 p.m., Duffy said.

Noble and Duffy said they were not sure whether Croft was wearing a helmet at the time of the accident. She was the only person struck by the tree, they said.

Three motorcyclists from Massachusetts and Connecticut were killed Friday afternoon in Stoddard. A Sunday afternoon crash in Thornton on Route 49 claimed the lives of three more bikers. Both accidents involved other motor vehicles.
