My First Motorcycle Road Trip

Ok...as far as "First Motorcycle Trips" go, mine is pretty boring. But no one else sent me one this month, so here's mine. In fact, mine is so boring, I'm going to tell you two and a half stories...

First the half-story, End of July/Aug 2010: This trip wasn't a proper "Road Trip", in that we figured the two of us wouldn't be sufficiently comfortable on the K100 to do a long-distance trip on just the bike, so we planned to trailer the bike to various base camps in the UP, and bike around from there. Targets included St. Ignace, Houghton, and maybe Marquette.

So, I bought a Harbor Freight trailer, and set it up to be a pretty decent motorcycle trailer. Spent a few weeks of weekends and evenings building it up (a much larger task than I anticipated), the week we were planning on leaving, I put Hilde up on the trailer, and dragged her around and even to-and-from work one day just to get the feel of the vehicle with the trailer and shake down the trailer and restraints on the bike before committing to a 600 mile trip.

And then the disaster happened, two days before our departure, I realize Hilde's key is missing. Yeah, I never actually got around to making a spare copy of my one key for the bike. I called the dealer, and they could get me a new key based on the VIN number, but couldn't get it in just one day. Now, you can imagine Paula's reaction when I told her. However, we ended up having a pretty good vacation, just without the bike (and Paula has a spare key for all my bikes, now!).

Next story: first week of October, 2010: Monday, I look at the weather, and the forecast for the weekend is looking GREAT. So I call Paula and ask if she can get Friday off to make a three day vacation, she can, I can, so we decide to try to try a mini-motorcycle tour, trailer to St. Ignace, then ride to Tahquamenon Falls. Friday afternoon, we drive to St. Ignace. Saturday, we had a great ride to the falls, we managed to hit the peak color weekend. Paula summed it up as "the falls were great, but the ride to and from was even better!". Ride was a little cool in the evening, but we did get our first warning of potential problems when I stopped for gas. I discovered the handlebar clamps had worked themselves slightly lose, and if I put too much pressure on them downwards, they'd slide down. No big deal, I thought – one doesn't put much vertical pressure on the bars, Usually.

Sunday, our day we were returning, was not so good. Before putting Hilde back on the trailer, we took her for a little ride around St. Ignace, where we came across a group of three dogs that were very interested in the front wheel of the bike. After finally shaking off the dogs (no harm done to either dogs or us), we pulled into the parking lot of the motel, and prep to put the bike on the trailer. Error 1: I didn't have Paula get off before low speed positioning of the bike. Error 2: remember the lose handle bar? Yeah. Low speed positioning of the bike, turned the bar, put some pressure on it, it folded up, and the rest of the bike followed suit. Well, we are both a little bruised (Paula: "LITTLE???"), but I get the bike back up. Now...to get bike on the trailer. There are two ways to get a bike on a trailer - walk it up the ramp or ride it up. Both suck. Up to this point, I had walked the bike up the ramp. For some reason, I decide (Error 3) this is a good time to RIDE it up the ramp. Error 4: I do it with insufficient gusto, and the bike comes to a dead stop mid-way up the ramp, with the inevitable slow-motion tip-over. And unlike laying flat in the parking lot as it was doing a few minutes earlier, now it is part hooked on the trailer, part on the ramp, and part on the ground, and MORE than 90 degrees over from where it should be. This story is being ended here, as the rest basically consists of freeing the bike and trailer, finding all the broken bits of plastic, getting the bike back on the trailer, and driving home with a broken bike staring accusingly at me in the rear-view mirror of the tow vehicle the rest of the way home.

In 2014, we did a our first REAL motorcycle trip to Traverse City, St. Ignace, Sault Ste Marie and Tahquamenon Falls on Wolfie, our LT, but the trip was absolutely perfect, and thus isn't overly entertaining.

It's very easy to do on line - if you use a computer for anything. I know of no one who has converted to online banking and then gone back to the old (check writing) way. MEMBERSHIP RENEWALS for 2016 (Repeat Info)

Membership stands at 29 for 2016 and the password for access to "Members" at the Yahoo Group will be changed soon. If you do not renew your membership by February 14, you will not receive the new password for accessing the 'Members Only' information on the Yahoo Group.

All renewal dues for 2016 should be paid by the end of January 2016, but we have no penalty for late renewals. We just want you back. The BEST (and cheapest) way to pay any dues, reservations, etc. to the club is to use your Bank/CU "Bill Pay" service – at no cost to you.

PayPal (REPEAT INFO)

As of 1/25/15, 12 members have used PayPal to pay the club for membership renewals and club events. If you have a PayPal account, the club pays no fee for any transfer of money –IF YOU CALL ME FAMILY/FRIEND rather than indicating that you are paying for product/service. You will, however pay a small fee (<\$1). The club's PayPal account is Jim@Ridingiswonderful.com That account is not for my personal use.

<u>If you don't have a PayPal account</u>, you can transfer/send money to the club, but the MCBeembers will be charged a small fee (>\$1), which we have been willing to pay. You will need to choose your bank account or Credit/Debit Card if you don't have a PayPal account. <u>We want you to have the convenience of being able to use PayPal</u>.

For our Canadian members, it appears that there's not much difference ... other than a built in 'exchange rate' at the time money is sent.

If you have an E-mail address, you can <u>set up a free PayPal account</u> from which you can send money and also receive money.

It's probably a wise suggestion that you use an E-mail address that you are not going to change. The process is free, if you link your PayPal account to a Credit/Debit Card. It's secure and if you already do some 'online banking', I can't imagine that you would have any difficulty. The process will take 2-3 days but only requires about 4-8 minutes of your time (more if you study all of their 'agreement'). Here's the process:

- 1. Log on to <u>www.PayPal.com</u>
- 2. Click on "personal" in the top left
- 3. Click on "sign up" in the top right
- 4. You'll be asked to provide personal information, then to read and agree to their agreement.
- 5. When done, you'll be asked to provide Credit/Debit Card and/or bank info. Then you'll need to <u>wait</u> for a couple of days.
- 6. You'll be asked to check your bank statement within a few days. PayPal will make small deposits into your account. You'll need to know those deposit amounts in order to activate your account.
- 7. You'll also be asked to choose a few security questions and answers in case you forget your password.
- 8. From that point onward, you have a free PayPal account touted as "The world's favorite way to pay and get paid".
- 9. There are limits to this personal, free account, but it should be sufficient for most of us.

You can have two lines of text, the first your name, and you can add a nick name as the second.
