

Prez Sez Nick Holland



Once again, I am going from "how did we end up on the year 2023??" to "what happened to 2023??". But here we are.

I've been riding BMWs now for probably 14 years. So, yes, I tend to notice when I see a BMW motorcycle on the road. I've noticed it didn't seem to happen very often – until recently. I now frequently see BMWs on the road. I got to believe it is due to Jennifer O. at BMW Detroit kicking butt and taking money. Good work! Of course, the other thing I see a lot more of lately is Triumphs. In this case, it could very well be due to the fact that Triumphs are now in my life due to our new host for our meetings. I'm a big fan of diversity in motorcycles, and honestly, I like the direction our club is heading – multi-brand.

This month, we have our annual Chicken Dinner at Frankenmuth planned. That will be Saturday, September 16, at Zehnder's. Sounds like it will be a fairly small group this year, but it isn't too late to join in – be at our meeting Saturday, 9/16 and pay your \$5. Next month, we have the picnic. We should be getting details to you shortly on that.

I still get asked occasionally what the long term plans for the club, which mostly boil down to these questions:

- Are we going to stay at Triumph Detroit, or are we going to move back to BMW Detroit when their new showroom is complete? I have no plans or desire to revert back to BMW Detroit. As long as Triumph Detroit is willing and seeming eager to host us, I consider them our home. Motor City Beemers has been around for a long time (over thirty years!), and is on at least our *fourth* physical location (not counting the period of no home!), and if I recall the history properly, at the *fourth* owner of our hosting dealership. SOMEDAY, we may need to hunt for a new home. "But what about the BMW Detroit's new showroom?" What about it? Good for them, they needed a new, larger showroom. I'm glad they have that now. But in the time I've been with the MCBeemers, the staff at BMW Detroit has not had a lot of interest in the club. Triumph Detroit has shown us great support and participation. So until/unless Triumph Detroit decides we are no longer welcome, I'm not shopping around for another location for our meetings.
- Are we going to change the name of the club? (often phrased more directly as, "What are we going to change the name to?") Short answer: I have NO plans or desire to change the name of the club from Motor City Beemers. I have significant desire to retain the established name. Long answer: Again, long term, things may change, but we have over thirty years as the Motor City Beemers. A group/business/club name, yes, reflects the purpose of the group, but it also reflects its history. As people, our parents chose names for us for various reasons, but by the time we have a few years behind us, our names reflect who WE are, not the original intent of our parents. I look at the club name in much the same way. Are we going to lose potential members because their favorite motorcycle brand isn't in the club name? Perhaps. But as a multi-brand club, I'm not seeing this as a huge loss. If you only want to hang around with only Brand X owners, this probably isn't your club. This will also make it easier for past members who drifted away from the club or away from motorcycles for a period of time to find us again. I see a lot of penalties in changing our name, I don't see any real benefits in doing so. (I've got even longer answers, but I'll spare you).
- **Are we still shutting down the club?** I'm not overly fond of the phrase "shutting down the club", but technically, yes we are still planning on eventually invoking article 10 of the bylaws and dissolve the group

as defined by the bylaws, but not as a group of people. My hope is that this will create a simpler group with less structure where people can get together monthly or more often if desired. So...change the structure of the club to a non-financial group. Now, if we have some people step up to put the time and effort into running the club, nothing is final. Heck, nothing is cast in stone if we do officially dissolve the club. As I have mentioned a number of times, we have a shortage of people willing and able to help run the club. It has been suggested we could amend the existing club bylaws to reduce the number of officers required, but that doesn't change the basic issue – there's a lack of people willing to put the effort in to help run the club. This seems to be a general problem, I've talked to a number of people in other motorcycle (and other!) clubs that are running into the same problem.

• **I disagree with your plans!** Great. Step up, accept an officer's position in the club, and lead us in your better direction. It's that simple.

As always, the recipe to success of the Motor City Beemers is to bring more people into the group. This isn't something we can rely on others to do for us — we need to be our own recruiters. I'm not going to say there's one answer to how this should be done, but I'd suggest printing out and carrying some of our Club Invite Cards with you (yes, they have been updated for our new situation). 

Junction of Hope Restaurant 4136 Peet Rd, Chesaning, Mi. 48616 (9:00)


The Tridge, Ashman St., Midland (11-12).


Stop in Cadillac.


