"WHO"S THE NEWBIE?"

Meet John Hooper

<u>Early years:</u> 'Born and reared in central Georgia, before 8 years in the USAF as an Avionics Technician - until September, '68. Masters Degree from the University of Georgia in Trade and Industrial Education. Spent some time as a high school assistant principle, principle, and associate school superintendent, then 3 years at the Georgia Dept of Education. From there he became the Director of a Vocational College of about 500 full time students and another 1200 part time students. After "living hard" for 2 years with an inherited civil rights complaint, he found a new home with GM.

<u>Career:</u> He credits the Lord's care for 22 great years at GM where he got to lead the training effort in a Plant on the latest state of the art controls and processes. He and his family moved to MI in June '03. His wife, Mary Ann, oldest daughter (Jennifer) and her 4 children love it here. He was a contractor to GM through 2006.

<u>Current Involvement:</u> He lives in Shelby Township (south side of 21 Mile Road between Schoenherr and Hayes where he serves as President of the Homeowner's Association). He and his wife are active members of Saint Paul's United Methodist Church in Rochester. He is a member of the Men's Club and works in the Kitchen at the Baldwin Center Soup Kitchen in Pontiac on Mondays.

<u>Riding Experiences:</u> He is "new" again to riding. He rode small bikes in 2 previous lives: 1) While stationed in Japan with the USAF, '65-68. The roads and traffic in Tokyo were particularly good for bikes, but the maximum speed limit was 37 mph.

2) While attending the University of Georgia, his Honda 175 twin solved his parking problems and was fine for a 3 mile trip to campus. But was a killer on the highway at 60 mph. His neighbor and he had dreamed of riding bikes through the mountains and down the coast. His neighbor rode a blistering 100cc Honda! Needless to say, they never made a road trip, but they enjoyed dreaming.

He had always wanted a Goldwing. But then he went to the Beemership here in Warren with his youngest daughter to pick up the tag for a new BMW she and her husband purchased in the spring. He saw this used K1200LT, for what he foolishly thought was a give away price and found he could not live without it!!

Having always wanted to go on long rides on a bike that would not beat him up or tire him out, the LT is just the bike! This past summer has been a total re-learning experience for him. First, he could always man-handle the small bikes he rode in the past, but not this boy! You have to ride the LT!! You can't throw it around.

He has ridden about 4000 miles this summer and feels pretty confident on it. He still, on occasion, looks down when stopping and has been known to drop the bike in very embarrassing circumstances, like lunch at the French Laundry!! He is glad to report that he had not dropped it in quite some time until then. It just proves that he is still learning and there is a difference between manhandling a 175 bike and riding an 836 pound cruiser! Old habits are hard to brake!

His riding during the summer typically was to take a day, usually Tuesday, and ride the Thumb. By the time he returned home, he had racked up another 175 to 250 miles. Stopping to see the sites and take in the atmosphere was so much fun! He stopped at places he would never have stopped had he been in a car. The people are so friendly! The guess is they see some old geezer on a bike and take pity on him.

He did take the Riders Edge Class in June at the Harley Dealer in Port Huron and looks forward to taking a re-fresher class next spring, the Performance Based Course.

He has visions of spending a week or so in the UP next summer riding and camping in their pop-up. His wife has learned to tolerate him and his bike, but so far has not had any desire to ride with him. Maybe she will change next year, but don't bet on it!
