The New Riding Season by Pete Lentini

If you wandered down the aisles of the recent bike show in Novi I suspect your desire to get on the bike is overwhelming. Drooling over the new 2011 models always fosters a much-anticipated launch into the official riding season. We yearn for fresh adventures on original roads with newfound friends. It's all part of the anticipation and excitement that fill our thoughts during a typical arctic January. Did you know The Riding Season is actually comprised of a number of smaller, sub-seasons?
