#### Waldo, Ohio Fried Baloney Ride, Aug 18

"Saturday morning, August 18 could not have been a better day for a bike ride, especially for a bike ride to Waldo Ohio. Once again members of the Motor City Beemers headed to the land of Buckeye to partake of the world famous fried baloney sandwich. At 8:30 sharp two members Rhys Blair and Layne Steward departed the Beemership for Waldo. We picked up a third member Joe Dfelio in front of the Kmart store and our fourth member John Saarinen several blocks south on Van Dyke at a gas station, all without missing beat or having to pullover. Joe couldn't catch a break with the traffic lights and John had just picked up his trusty steed from Don at the shop and needed fuel. We dutifully rode through traffic along Van Dyke to I-696 and then south on I-75 to exit 15. This is our exit for picking up our members from the west and the south of Detroit. Here we found JJ of Flatrock and Larry Turk of Dearborn. We all made the routine rest stop ritual, traded niceties and then mounted up for the ride to the next rest area on U.S. 23 south of Upper Sandusky. It should be noted that with us on this trip were two fried baloney "virgins". Layne and JJ had never heard of, been or tasted a "world famous fried baloney sandwich." What a treat we had in store for them. So the four K-bikes and two R-bikes made our way to Ohio. We pulled into the rest area on 23 about 11:00 a.m. and were on the road again by 11:30. By 12:15 p.m. we were in downtown Waldo and 10 minutes later seated in the G&R Tavern. No wait, no nothing, we had a table for 6, menus and our drinks already ordered. In the meantime we explained to our "virgin" friends what a treat they were in for. We basically all ordered the same thing the same way... regular sandwich with cheese, pickles and onion. Someone ordered mayonnaise on theirs and someone else held the pickles. We all ordered onion rings! I couldn't wait to see the look on JJ and Layne's faces when the sandwiches arrived. Words can't describe their expressions. Even though we very carefully explained what they were going to get, they had no idea. It was beautiful. We even had an order of deep fried pickles accidently delivered to our table which were eaten promptly. The only thing missing was lves and his comments that went along with every meal on all of his trips. During the meal we spoke of PIE, yes even while we were gorging ourselves with fried baloney, we were talking about PIE. The best pie in the Midwest, the biggest pieces of pie in the Midwest, the most whipped cream on pie in the Midwest and you guessed it, everyone but John ordered PIE...he had to go out and check on an oil leak on his recently repaired iron steed. But the rest of us ate PIE. JJ had coconut cream, Layne I think had banana cream, Larry had Dutch apple and I had peanut butter chocolate cream pie!

Oh, oh Joe didn't have pie; I don't know why he didn't have pie! I ordered an extra sandwich to go for Jill and then we were off to people watch on the corner. 2012 Color Tour; October 20-21, 2012

So, if you have never been on our annual color tour, let me give you a little history. The color tour was originally founded by our our Ryan and Rhys Blair. It was a cozy little group that took our sleeping bags and stayed at the Blair Cabin at Lake of the North. I am not really sure how long we have been doing this, but I think it is about 15 years or so.

On my very first color tour, we had a wonderful supper at Leggs Inn and then road to the cabin, about 15-20 miles in the rain and snow . . . about 3 inches of sticky wet snow by the time we made the 2.5 hour ride.

Don't let that scare you. I have been leading the ride since Rhys retired as ride leader a few years back and the weather has been fairly cooperative. We had a little rain one year, but no more snow.

Leggs Inn is located at Cross Village, at the north end of the tunnel of trees. They are very traditional Polish Restaurant and the weekend of October 20th is there last weekend of the season. So the menu is sometimes limited, but the food is always great.

This is about a 600 mile weekend, give or take and we have a planned route up on Saturday and everyone tends to go their own way home on Sunday. There will be a route home, but I leave between 8-9AM, so if you plan on sleeping in, better plan of finding your own way home too...:)

We will leave Hope Junction at 11:00AM sharp.....

IF YOU GOING ON THE COLOR TOUR I NEED YOUR MONEY TO HOLD THE CABINS...

I have reserved three cabins at Leggs Inn for our annul color tour ride.

The cost remains the same.... \$25.00 each as long as we fill the cabin... unfilled cabins will split the cost equally amongst the number of riders in the cabins. NO Exceptions... First Come First Served Basis. The cabins have 2 bedrooms each with a queen size bed... and 2 day beds.... a total of 4 can comfortable sleep in each cabin.

Couples in the bedroom are charged as 1. Bedrooms go to couples first and then on a first come, first served basis to others. I will not hold cabins for any couple unless they have paid before September 31st, 2012. In order to get a spot in a cabin you MUST pay in advance. 


