2012 Color Tour; October 20-21, 2012

This year's Color Tour was my first in 6 years and I have to tell you, it was no disappointment and a far cry better than the ones I used to lead. Mother Nature didn't cooperate very much the first 2 hours of the ride out of the BMW Dealership. We caught a light rain on Hall Road going west and rain all the way up I-75 to the breakfast meeting place at 10:00 a.m.

Breakfast was great, people wandered in from 9:15 until after 10:00 so we were in different stages of breakfast throughout. At 11:00 we all suited up and remounted and ready to go by 11:15 except for one soul who had to ride back a mile or so for gas. Once on the road though it was pretty smooth going. I even had the route in my GPS so I knew where we were going from the second position in the procession of 8 bikes. Every mile west the weather seemed to get better and eventually the sun popped out and the temperature got up to 57-58 by mid-afternoon. Our first stop for gas was uneventful except for the fact there was no public restrooms, which makes it rough on our female riders. Leaving there we were up the road 5-6 miles when we had to stop...someone had forgot to pay for his or her gas and back we went. The next gas stop was the same, no public restrooms so we backtracked to a local park and used the facilities there.

This was a real color tour. The color peak had passed but the trees still holding their leaves for us to see had a great selection of reds, golds, and all the shades in between. I

was impressed. The roads were great too! I have been riding Michigan roads since 1980 and I was amazed at some of the roads that Ives and Ken found in mapping this route. Except for one road in particular I didn't think that the road surfaces were all that bad...maybe it was just knowing that this was probably one of the last big rides of the season, so I was savoring it. We finally got to Harbor Springs and headed up the 22 miles of The Tunnel of Trees. The road was pleasantly clear of leaves and water hazards as in past years and the road was very smooth. This part of the ride was the end of a 422 mile jaunt and I expected to be a little more tiring, but it was very pleasant and not as nearly as long as I remembered. As I was riding along I was remembering my first motorcycle ride through this area on M119 and it took me back to June of 1984 with the Jerseypine Cruisers and we were doing what was called then "Bust Your Buns" Tour around Lake Michigan in 3 days with 2-25 riders. We left from Chicago on a Friday morning and returned to Chicago sometime on Sunday afternoon, hopefully with all the riders you started out with.

I digress; we pulled in to Cross Village and found our cabins and checked in, unpacked and headed for the restaurant for dinner. When we arrived in the lounge we found there were now 18 for dinner. What a nice surprise. We were seated around 8:15 I think, maybe earlier and we had two great servers work our two tables. Dinner was great, way too much food and drink as usual. By 10:30 or so I was in bed and sound a sleep, but I know there were a few souls checking out the meteor show outside in the dark sky.

Morning come much too early for most. Some folks were gone by 7:00; I didn't get out of bed until 7:30, but was on the road by 9:15 after some friendly conversation with folks from our cabin and the one next to ours out by the bikes. I know some riders were meeting in Brutus for breakfast, but this rider was headed for our cottage to winterize it for the upcoming cold weather and snow, so I had breakfast at Betty's in Boyne Falls.

Again kudos to Ives and Ken for putting together another great Color Tour for the Club. It has really grown from the 3-4 of us back in 1995-96 when we went to our cottage and then up to Leggs and back to our cottage to spend the night. This was indeed a real color tour!




