Another 21 people paid for Frankenmuth reservations during the club meeting which <u>added \$105 to the CkBk</u>. Two more paid cash for Frankenmuth before the extended deadline on Monday which added another \$10 to the CkBk.

One used PayPal to pay for Frankenmuth and the Color Ride just before the extended deadline, but \$35 was removed to pay Ives for the Color Ride which left \$5 to PayPal. Total count for Frankenmuth was 32 by the deadline.

Three non-member guests showed up at Frankenmuth for dinner on 9/20/14 and paid for their meals. Sharon S. brought a Rewards Card for meals along with \$60 in coupons that went toward the total cost of the meals & drinks. Maybe John & Sharon will write an article about the card and how each of you can use it to benefit the club. A total of 33 meals were purchased and 19 drinks. With coupons, tips, etc. the bill was \$900.00. A check for \$865 was reimbursed to me since I paid w/my credit card.

Robert Green purchased a BMW from the Dealership in June and is welcomed as our newest member but that didn't last long. He rides a new 1600 and brought our active membership to 81.

Just before the end of the month, we had Bill Harlan from Rochester Hills send his application for membership and a check to bring our active membership to 82, but that didn't last long either. Bill's check for \$15 was added to the checkbook balance.

On Sunday September 28<sup>th</sup> I received an application from Doron & Julia Helfman from West Bloomfield. They purchased a new 1200 from Tony and brought our active membership to 84.

## Fall Color Tour - Leggs Inn Ride (repeat info)

Date: October 18th-19th

Location: We will meet at Junction of Hope, 4136 Peet Rd (M-13), Chesaning, MI 48616 (989) 845-2139 This is actually about 5 miles or so West of Montrose City on M-57, West of M-13

Time: Arrive 10:00AM - leaving at 11:00 AM SHARP

This will be our brunch stop and the only food stop until dinner at Legg's Inn at Cross Village. We do of course make fuel stops.

I have reserved cabins 1,2 & 3. The cost has increased this year to \$30.00 each and your spot is ONLY reserved when you have paid in advance of the trip. I will release the cabins not spoken for on October 1st.

As always, there are 2 bedrooms and 2 day beds for each cabin. Bedrooms are a first come, first served basis, with the only exceptions being couples (still \$30.00 for a bedroom).

If the cabin does not have 4 occupants, then the cost might be increased to help balance the cost. For those that get a day bed, it is recommend to bring a sleeping bag. Blankets are provided, but can be in short supply if it is really cold.

For those new members, this is a weekend ride. We ride a winding route up thru lower Michigan from our brunch spot and try to arrive at Leggs Inn by around 6PM. We get settle in cabins and then walk up the hill to Leggs in for a traditional Polish dinner.

The ride up is planned and we ride as a group. You can either decide to ride home alone and get up whenever you want, or there a are usually many small groups you can tag along with.

We ride, RAIN or SHINE.... I will post the latest GPS site to this eGroup closer to the date.

PayPal by Jim Mick

You are seeing more and more information in our newsletter about having the option to *use PayPal* for MCBeemers dues and other payments so there are even more reasons to avoid sending checks.

If you have a PayPal account, neither you, nor the club pays a fee for any transfer of money (if you use the option of sending money to family and friends). The club's PayPal account is <a href="mailto:lim@Ridingiswonderful.com">Jim@Ridingiswonderful.com</a> That account is not for my personal use.

If you don't have a PayPal account, you can transfer/send money to the club without YOU being charged a fee, but the MCBeembers will be charged a small fee, which we have been willing to pay. You will need to choose your bank account or Credit/Debit Card if you don't have a PayPal account. We want you to have the convenience of being able to use PayPal.

If you have an E-mail address, you can <u>set up a free PayPal account</u> from which you can send money and also receive money.

It's probably a wise suggestion that you use an E-mail address that you are not going to change. The process is free, if you link your PayPal account to a Credit/Debit Card. It's secure and if you already do some 'online banking', I can't imagine that you would have any difficulty. The process will take 2-3 days but only requires about 4-8 minutes of your time (more if you study all of their 'agreement'). Here's the process:

- 1. Log on to www.PayPal.com
- 2. Click on "personal" in the top left
- 3. Click on "sign up" in the top right
- 4. You'll be asked to provide personal information, then to read and agree to their agreement.
- 5. When done, you'll be asked to provide Credit/Debit Card and/or bank info. Then you'll need to wait for a couple of days.
- 6. You'll be asked to check your bank statement within a few days. PayPal will make small deposits into your account. You'll need to know those deposit amounts in order to activate your account.
- 7. You'll also be asked to choose a few security questions and answers in case you forget your password.
- 8. From that point onward, you have a free PayPal account touted as "The world's favorite way to pay and get paid".
- 9. There are limits to this personal, free account, but it should be sufficient for most of us.
- 10. If you discover something is different than noted, please educate me.
