

Editor's Corner Nick Holland



Weather is getting colder. I've cleaned up the garage and got room now for all five(!) motorcycles for their (hopefully) short winter's nap. And at least one is easily extracted for the expected November and hoped for December riding. Yeah, I'm an optimist.

I'm rather surprised how fast modern vehicles will kill their batteries when not driven for a few weeks. Even my '85 K100 managed to not only drain, but damage its battery when unused most of the summer due to a coolant leak I convinced myself I'd get around to fixing myself. By the time I finally got around to giving up and taking it into Don at Detroit BMW, the battery not only could not start the bike, but had difficulty taking a charge. Paula's winter car was parked just part of the summer, and when we got

around to trying to move it, the battery was so dead, it was if it wasn't even in the car. Fortunately, it responded well to a jump and a charge.

So...the thought of the week is "battery tenders". Usual recommendation is the "Battery Tender Jr" available from many sources for around \$40, Personally, I've had great luck with the \$10 Harbor Freight "float charger", which if you keep an eye on their sales, coupons and specials has often been available for around \$6. To make life easy, I added a Powerlet plug (at twice the price of the charger), so I don't have to dig my way to the battery on my BMWs. If you go that route, make sure your Powerlet socket is connected to the battery when the bike is off. For example, my LT's front Powerlet socket is always connected to the battery (good for charging), the one for the passenger is only connected when the key is in certain positions (bad for charging!).

The alternative to a battery tender (or float charger) is to disconnect the battery – or even better, remove the battery to keep it warm in the house. But that's a lot of work, especially on some BMWs, and in the case of some BMWs (and many cars), you will have some things to reset when the battery is reconnected.

Unless you really have an obsessive streak, get one per vehicle you are putting in storage. I've heard people tell me they will move the tender from vehicle to vehicle. Maybe some people will, but I never would. And if you happen to have a lucky "perfect day for riding" in January, don't forget to reconnect your tender after, or you may have a dead battery in March (voice of experience!).

I have been informed that a certain Pete we all miss actually reads the newsletter, so, "Hi, Pete!" (and for that matter..."hi!" to all the other people who actually read it!)

It's very easy to do on line - if you use a computer for anything. I know of no one who has converted to online banking and then gone back to the old (check writing) way. About an hour and a half into our ride toward Lexington Harbor we stopped at Rose Bud Café for a stretch break. Rose Bud Café is a 'LANDMARK' for the MCBeemers Club and often a gathering place, so I gave



the short story about why... Established in Clifford in 2008, this very small restaurant was discovered by Rhys B. while he worked for AT&T. Rhys was in that area about meal time, discovered it, was drawn to it because "they have the best cinnamon rolls and sticky buns around". Rhys has brought some from the club here several times. We stopped for a stretch break, warm up, etc. with the intention of just stretching, but Dave F. (the club's newest member) and George D. did go inside for a cup of coffee while the rest of us waited outside.

Hannah S. was noticing very dark skies rolling in from the NW while I was checking for messages. Since two riders were wearing 'snowmobile suits', we should expect SNOW and we got some.

Leaving Rose Bud Café, we tried to not run back into the snow/rain mix that just passed over, but we ended up running out of pavement. At our next stop in Lexington, Dave F. asked the question: "Who didn't want to ride the gravel road back there?" A few of us raised our hands.
