We had reserved parking which if you have ever been to the Bavarian Inn Restaurant, you know that parking can be guite an adventure in itself. I led a group of 8 bikes from the Teds Coney Island in Richmond by first going east in order to take the group up to the curves on M136, then north up to Yale Rd. to take the curves up there then over to Yale for some fuel and a short leg stretch. Then on to Brown City, past Rhys on Clifford Rd, on to Mayville then Vassar and over to Frankenmuth. Just about 2 1/2 hours, nice little ride. Editor's Corner



We don't get to do a lot of long-distance riding like some of you do, but I do try to ride my motorcycle to work at least a few times per week, preferably most times per week during my riding season (which is defined, roughly, as "whenever I feel like it"). Unfortunately, some oddly planned and questionable construction has me "caging" much more than I'd like. Parking lot congestion and people wanting to make sudden lane changes is not something I really enjoy being on a bike for...I'm not wild about being in a car.

I think I promised an article about replacing tail lights with LED lights. Well, I think I've realized the best I can say is "try it" – the number of configurations and complications on different bike is too great for me to cover with

authority. Here's my observations and discoveries. In my case, my LT has five lights across the back:

Turn signal Running/Brake Running Running/Brake Turn signal

Turn signals are messy to play with – blinkers are load dependent, if you replace a turn signal bulb with an LED, things will often work poorly. I'm not seeing a lot of point there, either, so this doesn't bother me.

Now, the three center lights on my LT were all the same kind of bulb, but the center one didn't have the bright filament attached to anything. This could be kinda slick – if you discover one of your brake lights are out, you could swap with the center running light bulb, and get back on the road with almost the same level of safety. It turned out if the CENTER bulb is swapped out with an LED bulb, the brake system computer will decide something is wrong (maybe you swapped out the bulb for one of the running/brake lights?) and flash the brake warning light at you. Note that this has nothing to do with the brakes or brake lights. So, I was only able to swap out the two running/brake lights with LEDs, but while I was there, I added a jumper between one of the brake lights and the center unused filament, so now when I hit the brakes, I have three bulbs light up – two super-fast LEDs, and one that wasn't doing anything before. I like. One thing, though – get RED LEDs, not white. The white ones will work, but going through the red filter, they'll come out a bit pink (unless that's your bike's color scheme!). While there, I added a flashing red light assembly that I picked up for about \$5 somewhere (don't ask – they don't have any more, sorry). I did a similar change to my Harley, and I'm very happy with that, as well.

As Pat said, officer elections are coming up. No question, the club is going to be going through some huge changes next year, NOTHING at this point is sacred, nor should any of our past traditions be considered sacred. Whomever we elect to lead us is going to help guide the group through some "interesting" times. As Richard Bach said, "What the caterpillar calls the end of the world, the master calls a butterfly.", those that take over are going to get to design the new butterfly. I suspect no one currently running the club would be insulted by someone offering to take their role over. I'll even buy lunch for someone who takes over the newsletter editor's role (hm. I better be careful, that might be considered reverse election fraud!).

Something else worthy of thinking about is club communications. Currently, we have two mechanisms in place – the Yahoo e-mail group and the MCBeemers Facebook group. I've heard some grumbles that people don't like the Yahoo e-mail group, but some aren't too fond of Facebook. One problem is any of the "free" answers are going to have some of the same issues as Facebook and Yahoo.
