



Editor's Corner Nick Holland



Here we are already August. Which means both our Chicken Dinner ride and our much delayed Picnic are coming up. I'm happy to report my milage total for the year is up by a factor of ten from last month's report, but sad to say, it's still in the low three digits.

Yet another reminder: if you wish to spend the night in Port Austin after the Chicken Dinner ride, make sure you make reservations with the Blue Spruce.

One thing one should never say to a Rhys story is "Baloney!", but the guy knows where to get the good stuff, it's in Waldo Ohio. And he's leading a ride there, details below!

Dinners: I think our July dinner at Twisted Rooster was a resounding success. Great attendance from members, and really good service from the restaurant. Does this mean it is time to consider resuming Wednesday dinners? Maybe it is. I think we need to discuss as a group the nature of the dinners, though – our old formula of "weekly and different place every week" wasn't working before. Maybe we need one place? Maybe monthly? Be ready to discuss at our next meeting.

A general reminder about dining out: the world is in a strange place right now – because people are both scared and getting paid to NOT work, almost every restaurant is running short-staffed and begging for workers. A friend of mine who is well connected in the food and dining industry told me about a friend of his begging his best cook to return to work for \$40/hr (over twice his 2019 pay) – and getting turned down. So don't take your frustrations out on the few people who actually show up to serve you. Big groups create special challenges for restaurants. So be patient; if you are in a hurry, I'd suggest eating at home. And show your gratitude for the service you do receive.

A brief, personal word. At the end of June, my younger brother died of cancer. When I was young, the rule was "No motorcycles at our house!" from my parents. Honestly, I never thought to try to change that rule, it sounded absolute. My brother, however, once he realized that fast as his car might be, most motorcycles could kick his butt, wanted a bike, a fast one. He managed to get my parents to acknowledge that he was a fairly safe and reasonable kid (exposed as somewhat misleading at his memorial!). With the "permission slip" in hand, he ran out and bought a bike. A very few weeks later, I got my own, with only token objections from my parents. I'm pretty sure his intent wasn't to enable my entry into the world of motorcycles, but he definitely got me into motorcycles at least a few years earlier than I would have, and enabled me to create some wonderful memories by having my bike in the UP my first senior year of school. That lead me to an adventure with a friend of mine, who ultimately lead to my being introduced to BMW motorcycles. So in short...you never know how you might influence someone else's life.



Waldo Ohio Baloney Ride

Here are the details for our annual Baloney Ride.

9:30 - Depart from BP truck stop at exit 15 southbound I-75 for Ohio. This is an ideal spot to top off your fuel, make a pit stop, grab a donut and a coffee. I usually arrive at approximately 9:00 a.m. to manage these tasks.

The route is I-75 south to I-280 south to Ohio 420. 420 turns into US 20/23 for several miles. At the US 23 turnoff we'll go south on two lanes through towns like Risingsun, Carey after which we'll be on a divided highway through Upper Sandusky and Marion. Ten miles south of Marion is the Waldo exit. We go right to stop sign, then left to the G&R Tavern which is on the right at the intersection. Arrive approximately noon.

We'll dismount, gather for a group photo under the wall sign. This is a riders destination so there may be a wait to get a table or we may have to eat at two different tables. This is an all day ride, we will stop at least once after departing the BP station for a comfort stop. If you aren't up to a 180 mile ride one way, this may not be the ride for you. If you don't like fried baloney there are other choices. Their fried baloney sandwiches and 4 inch cream pies are over 40 years of eating legend in these parts. If you like to ride and enjoy a fried baloney sandwich or cream pie this is your lucky day. If not then go to the Woodward Cruise this day.

By the way, for you first timers or procrastinators know this. I am prompt and am on schedule...see you on Saturday, August 21 at exit 15 9:00 a.m.

Poker Stops Report

Last month Jim Mick wrote about our Sunrise to Sunset trip. This year the route went as planned up until breakfast when Jim said if we drop south we can stop at Sleepy Hollow State Park. I agreed if he was willing to lead and he did. So my first Off the Beaten Path stop was Sleepy Hollow State Park. I have camped here with my Dad. I liked all the mountain bike trails they have. We drove by Ionia State Park but was raining and I did not see a safe place to turn around. My second Off the Beaten Path stop was Orchard Beach State Park. I have camped here two times. Then we stopped at Petoskey State Park. Jay likes to look for Petoskey Stones here but did not have an interest this time.



After Saturday Jay and I continued up the shoreline to Mackinaw City like we did last year. Next to the Tunnel of Trees one of my favorites routes was from Orchard Beach to Portage Lake along the shore. We stayed in Mackinaw at Americas Best Value Inn. Jay and I stayed here before in September several years ago. This hotel has a lot of potential, large indoor pool, large breakfast area and meeting area to play cards or visit for a large group. However, this visit I was a little disappointed. The Hotel needs renovation. I do not mind staying at an older place if it is clean and kept up. When we got to our room it was not done. They had another room they could give us the room was clean. In the pool area, towels were just thrown on the floor because they did not have a basket for wet towels.

Monday and Tuesday we stayed at an Airbnb in Manistique. Tuesday I went Kayaking in Munising to see the Pictured Rocks. Indian Lake and Palms Book was close to where we were staying in Manistique. Palms Book is an interesting State Park. They have a large raft on a pulley system that you can pull yourself across the lake.

The road was paved but there was a lot of pot holes to get there. It did take me down roads that I usually just drive by and we even found a small beach not far from Mackinaw.
