

Prez Sez Nick Holland

Greetings, Beemers!



This past month, a young friend I've known since he was about seven years old (and is now well into his twenties and living in California) called to tell me he bought his first motorcycle after taking the MSF class and getting his endorsement. I'm very proud of him, both in his accomplishments, but also in his care he has taken in doing this, and asking all kinds of insightful and well thought out questions before the class, and before and after getting the bike. He bought a "real", but modest bike, one that isn't crazy, but will also serve him for a number of years until he decides what kind of riding he enjoys most (AND stands a fair chance to serve him well, then, too). Good news, I understand his mother is still willing to talk to me! The only bad part? He has got more miles on his bike in the first week than I have all riding season (and he's in the land of no "non-riding" season!).

It's already September, which means our Frankenmuth Chicken Dinner is coming up (September 21). Again, as before, you pay \$5, we cover the rest. Sounds like we might have a few of our Florida Alumni joining us! There may be other things going on before or after – I'm sure Paula will be hitting her favorite Frankemuth stores, and some people may continue on to Port Austin as we have in the past (but...make your own plans for lodging, if you do).

A few years ago, we decided as a group to slowly re-form into a less formal club that didn't handle other people's money, and thus, not needing a formal set of bylaws or a charter. Just a group of people who like to get together, do stuff and ride together once in a while. That time is rapidly approaching. Our Treasurer, Jim, has reported it is likely at the end of our Frankenmuth event, we will probably have accomplished our goal of bringing the treasury down to zero, which means it is about time for the "Next Steps" in our clubs evolution (and yes, we have a plan in place in case the remaining funds don't cover everyone who shows up at Frankenmuth. Don't worry about that — it's still \$5).

But also with that, I plan to NOT run for club leader when my term ends (either next May, or when we formally dissolve the club, whichever comes first. I'd suggest holding off the dissolution vote until next May, in case people wish to step up as officers to maintain the current structure). My goal has been to bring the club to transition point in an orderly manner. I'm not sure how "orderly" it was, but we've reached that transition point. It is now going to be up to others to decide what to do next. My recommendation – which should hold no weight – is that we continue to meet at Triumph Detroit on the second Saturday, we continue to eat and ride together, but with fewer formal officers, and more "person who took the reins this week". But that's all up to the members to decide. As past officers have done, I plan to stay active in the club and provide guidance when asked, but also to stay out of the way of whatever people wish to do.

As I've said before, while formally, it may be the "end" of the Motor City Beemers as defined by our bylaws, I don't see it as the end of the club as a group of people. It should be looked at as a great opportunity to do the things that the members wish to do, rather than just 20+ year old traditions (or keep doing the traditions, if that's what people want to do!)

Yes, it's September, as I'm writing this, I see a few days in the weather forecast where the high isn't expected to hit 70F (but the forecast has changed non-trivially since this morning). But that's good riding weather...so get out and ride! (and perhaps I can follow my own advice).
